FEDERAL FLOOD INSURANCE NOW AVAILABLE IN OVERISEL TOWNSHIP

Overisel Township is now a participant in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) effective January 29, 2020. Residents will be able to purchase flood insurance up to the limits under the Emergency Phase of the program. There is a 30-day waiting period before flood insurance goes into effect. For single-family dwellings, the building coverage limit is \$35,000 and content coverage limit is \$10,000. Renters can also protect their belongings by purchasing contents coverage. For commercial properties, the building and contents coverage limits are both \$100,000. Higher limits of coverage will be available after the initial Emergency Phase. Lenders must require borrowers whose properties are located in a designated flood hazard area to purchase flood insurance as a condition of receiving a federally backed mortgage loan in accordance with the Federal Disaster Protection Act of 1973. The NFIP is implemented through the Federal Emergency Management Agency. There are over 5 million flood insurance policies in more than 22,000 participating communities nationwide.

PERMITS

(Building, Electrical, Plumbing, Mechanical) are required for all construction (new building, remodeling, furnaces, water heaters, etc.) New homes on agricultural property need a Special Use Permit from the Township Planning Commission. All AG buildings need a Zoning Compliance Permit. Please contact Professional Code Inspections (PCI) for all permit applications and questions — 1-616-877-2000.

NO. 2008-2 RESTRICTS THE ACCUMULATION OF JUNK

Because Township officials are getting more complaints from residents regarding unsightliness of some township properties, it me be helpful to remind all Township residents of our "Junk Ordinance."

One purpose of the Ordinance is to restrict outdoor storage, parking or unreasonable accumulation of junk, unused, partially dismantled or non-operational motor vehicles, trailers, boats, household goods, machinery and equipment on premises not zoned for industrial use.

Another purpose is to avoid injury or hazards to children or others that are attracted to junk.

A third purpose is to avoid devaluation of property and the negative effects such junk has on adjoining properties and the neighborhood.

The ordinance, in part, defines "junk" as garbage, refuse, trash, scrap metals, rubber debris, rags, dismantled or wrecked vehicles or parts of vehicles, used building material, unused or abandoned motor vehicles, trailers, boas, refrigerators, household goods, machinery, building or construction materials for which no building permit has been applied or obtained, or any debris that presents a potential hazard to persons or property. Be reminded that if there is an unlicensed vehicle on your property, it is supposed to be inside a building.

Household goods are further listed as all furniture, furnishings and household items that are designed for use inside the residence.

The ordinance states that it is unlawful for "junk" to remain outside of a dwelling or building.

It is the duty of the Township Supervisor or designated person to enforce this ordinance. It usually starts with sending a letter (may be certified or registered) to notify the owner or occupant of the violation. 30 days are allowed to correct the situation unless there is immediate danger. In that case, the property owner may be assessed for all removal costs.

If the owner or occupant refuses to correct the situation, Overisel Township Board may take legal action to enforce the ordinance.

Anyone interested in reading the ordinance in its entirety may call the Township Hall to request a copy.

FROM ASSESSOR – LISA FREEMAN

Home sales continued to be strong during 2019 resulting in an increase in values for the 2020 assessment year. Land values for all classes (Agriculture, Commercial, Industrial and Residential) increased as well.

Building permits are required for new construction including decks, accessory buildings, and additions. Please apply for a demolition permit before you teardown a building. Farmers need to file a use permit for construction of barns. Contact Professional Code Inspectors for all permit information (1-616-877-2000.)

The State of Michigan requires assessors to perform a physical inspection of 20% of the township each year. Due to Covid-19, I will be taking pictures from the road and sending a letter requesting verification of assessing information. Thank you for your cooperation; it's been enjoyable meeting Overisel Township residents.

NOTE REGARDING RECYCLING

We have been warned not to contaminate recycling with household or hazardous trash. If something is determined as contaminated, the entire truck load becomes unfit for recycling. Also, please do not leave garbage or junk outside of bins. If this continues, this privilege can be terminated.

The recycle bins are located in the Township Hall parking lot. The "single stream" does not require residents to separate material. Glass, paper, metal cans, plastic, flattened cardboard can be recycled. Recycle paper using the Paper Gators at Oakland CRC, Overisel RC, or Bentheim Elementary School.

Paper Gators accept newsprint, catalogs, magazines, junk mail, phone books, office/school paper, hard and soft cover books. (NO plastic, metal trash, glass, cardboard, or paperboard – grocery item boxes.) By supporting these area Paper Gators, you are saving taxpayer money. The township – (i.e. you the taxpayer) – pays for the paper in the Recycling Bins.

2020 CENSUS

Every 10 years the U.S. government conducts a census. This is important for determining distribution of Federal funds and also determines redistricting of Federal and State offices. When the 2020 Census comes to you in your mailbox, please be sure to complete and return it as instructed.

TRANSFER STATION INFORMATION

To use the transfer station, (1/4-mile North of Sandyview School on 46th St.) you must buy a "card." The card cost is \$20.00. Township residents can purchase a card at the Transfer Station. The charges are based on the volume being dumped. It is open on the first and third Saturday of teach month from 8AM – 5PM. (Closed holidays, January and February.) Please be reminded that we cannot accept yard waste, asphalt shingles, major appliances, tires or oil-based paints.

RENEWAL MILLAGES for Township Roads, Fire and Police Protection will be on the ballots this year.

SUMMER TAX BILLS are sent out July 1 and may be paid July 1 – September 14. If you or your mortgage company didn't get one, please call the Township Hall and leave a message. It is the taxpayer's responsibility see that tier taxes are paid.
