August 6 - PRIMARY ELECTION

In-person voting ON Election Day (August 6) will be at the Overisel Township Hall. Polls will be open from 7am-8pm.

OR you can vote in person on any of the **Early Voting** days (July 27-August 4). Early voting will be held at **Salem Township Hall**, 3003 142nd Ave. Located between the Salem Library and Bunker Hill restaurant. Polls are open 8:30am-4:30pm

November 5 - GENERAL ELECTION

In-person voting ON Election Day (November 5) will be at the Overisel Township Hall. Polls will be open from 7am-8pm.

OR early voting will be at **Salem Township Hall** (October 26-November 3). Polls open from 8:30am-4:30pm.

The clerk will be available Tuesdays 9am-5pm, and Saturday August 3 and November 2 8am-4pm for **voter registration**.

If you have requested to be on the Permanent Ballot list, you will automatically receive your ballot in the mail.

Summer Tax Information

Summer taxes were mailed out June 27. If you did not receive one, and should have, please leave a message on the township phone, 269-751-7030, or email Rachel, OveriselTreasurer@gmail.com. It is the owner's responsibility to make sure their taxes are paid.

Taxes are due on Monday, Sept 16 without interest. Interest and penalty accrual rates are listed on the bill insert. If you qualify to defer your summer taxes, deferment forms are due back to the office by Sept 16.

Summer tax bills will now be mailed on PINK paper. Winter bills will be on BLUE.

Winter bills will be mailed November 28, and will be due February 14. If you deferred your summer taxes, they will also be due February 14.

Recycling

Recycle bins are located at the township hall. The "single stream" means no sorting. Glass, paper, metal cans, plastic, flattened cardboard are accepted. NO TRASH.

Cemetery Reminders

- **Handled pails need to be picked up by October 12. Any pails left will be put in the building at the cemetery. In the spring they will be put outside.

- **The caretakers are asking, if you leave a memory item on the grave, that you please come back in a timely manner and remove the item(s). Caretakers are not responsible for items left and have the authority to remove items in a timely manner.

Permits

(Building, Electrical, Plumbing, Mechanical) are **required** for **all** construction (new building, remodeling, furnaces, water heaters, etc.) **New homes on agricultural property need a Special Use Permit** from the Planning Commission. **All AG buildings need a Zoning Compliance Permit.** Permit applications and questions contact Professional Code Inspections (PCI) at 1-616-877-2000. **If you remove a structure, notify the assessor.**

Reminder: All new construction (as well as demolitions and finishing basements) requires a building permit. Applications for Building Permits go to Professional Code Inspectors (PCI). Phone number is 1-616-877-2000.

Construction will take place in the right of way, extending 33 feet from the road centerline. You may notice construction activities in these areas as we install the necessary infrastructure. The process involves laying orange conduit, pulling fiber cables into the conduit, and placing white/orange markers along with green pedestals. Please rest assured that a restoration crew will follow the construction to ensure the area is returned to its original condition. 
A Message from the Allegan County Broadband Project:

Our comprehensive plan to bring high-speed internet to the residents of Allegan County is in process. While 123Net will be building fiber to serve over 12,000 residents, there are four other companies building grant subsidized fiber. Rural Digital Opportunity Fund grant projects are planned with Spectrum, Mercury Broadband and Midwest Energy & Communications (MEC.) Bloomingdale Communications is also building fiber with USDA Re-Connect grant funds.
