May 7- School Election – Renewal Operating Millage Proposals – Vote at the Overisel Township Hall 4307 144th Ave. Polls open 7am - 8pm

NOTE: NO Early Voting for the May 7 Election. ***The clerk's office will be open Saturday, May 4, from 7:00am - 3:00pm to register to vote.

August 6-Primary Election.

In-person voting on Election Day will be at the Overisel Township Hall. Polls open 7am-8pm

PLEASE NOTE: Early Voting for the August election (July 27 – August 4) will be <u>at the Salem</u>
Township Hall, 3003 142nd Ave. Dorr, MI 49323 (in Burnips, across from Bunker Hill) for all Overisel
Township and Salem Township residents. Polls will be open from 8:30am-4:30pm.

November 5 - General Election.

Election Day In-person voting will be at Overisel Township Hall. Early voting days for Nov. election are October 26 – Nov. 3. Hours and location for Early voting for the General Election to be determined.

Note regarding Recycling—

We have been warned not to contaminate recycling with household or hazardous trash. One contaminated item can make the entire load unfit for recycling. Do not leave garbage or junk outside of bins. If this continues, this privilege will be terminated. The recycle bins are located in the Township Hall parking lot. The "single stream" allows glass, paper, metal cans, plastic, <u>flattened</u> cardboard to be recycled together. (Recycle paper using the Paper Gators at Oakland CRC, Overisel RC., or Bentheim Elementary School.)

Paper Gators accept newsprint, catalogs, magazines, junk mail, phone books, office/school paper, hard and soft cover books, paperboard (cereal type boxes), cardboard smaller than 12"x12", wrapping paper (no foil/sparkles) and shredded paper. (NO plastic, metal, trash, glass, or cardboard larger than 12"x12"). By supporting these area paper gators you are saving taxpayer money. The township (i.e. you, the taxpayer) pays to recycle the paper in our recycling bins.

Junk Ordinance. The Township is getting many complaints about properties that are in violation of this ordinance. Vehicles need to be licensed and drivable to be parked on your property. If they are not licensed or drivable, they need to be inside a building or removed. We take pride in our Township being attractive and well-kept. This newsletter has information on how to dispose properly of things that need to be gotten rid of.

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>, the **Planning Commission** is working on updating our zoning book, and will be holding a public hearing early fall. More info will be in the August newsletter.

<u>NOTICE</u>—Rezone and Special Use Permits <u>MUST</u> be in 6 (six) weeks prior to requested meeting. NO EXCEPTIONS!

The Planning Commission meets the third Tuesday of February, May, August, & November. (To build a house on an Agricultural lot, you **MUST** have prior approval from the Planning Commission.)

<u>Permits</u> (Building, Electrical, Plumbing, Mechanical) are required for all construction (new building, remodeling, furnaces, water heaters, etc.) New homes on agricultural property need a Special Use Permit from the Planning Commission. All AG buildings need a Zoning Compliance Permit. Permit applications and questions contact Professional Code Inspections (PCI) at 1-616-877-2000. If you remove a structure, notify the assessor.

<u>Tax Bills</u> are mailed July 1, due September 14, and mailed December 1 and due February 14. If you or your mortgage company didn't get a bill, contact the township at 269-751-7030 and leave a message or email: treasurer@overiseltownship.org. It is the <u>owner's</u> responsibility to make sure their taxes are paid. **Please notify the township if there are any changes to your mailing address.


