Allegan County Resource Recovery is hosting a Regional Household Hazardous Waste/TV/Computer Recycling Event at the Republic Recycling Station. (See date, location and time on page 1). All materials received at this event will be recycled or properly disposed of by certified vendors that strive in protecting the environment. This is a great way to responsibly clean-out the garage, pole barn or basement.

Heath Township residents can drop off acceptable materials (detailed on page 1) at this event. Please present your Resource Recovery Card that is in with your winter tax receipt information to confirm eligibility.

Heath Township Curbside Recycling

Residents can participate in a curbside recycling program through the township. Recyclables are collected by Republic Services on the first Wednesday of each month. When the regularly scheduled collection day falls on or after a holiday in that week, service will be provided one day later. Materials must be set out the night before collection. This service is for residential homes only.

To sign up for this valuable program, please go to the Township Hall during office hours or call Allegan County Resource Recovery at 269-686-4559. (This service is funded by the \$36 surcharge on the winter tax bill.)

*Missed Customers/Weather Delays: Please contact Resource Recovery if you were missed on the regular scheduled pick-up day. Any weather related delays will be posted to the website referenced

The following recycling items can be comingled together: Plastic bottles and containers, metal cans, clear and colored glass, newspapers, paper, cardboard and magazines. Items must be clean! Fire Department News

In 2018 Hamilton Fire & Rescue responded to 437 incidents, which compares to 404 incidents for the year 2017, or a 9 % increase in incident volume. In the same time frame from 2016 to 2017 there was an 8 % increase in incident volume.

The MPSCS 800 radio system is being updated as new software programs are developed. Ottawa County is going to the same system, which has greatly improved the coverage area for Hamilton Fire & Rescue and northern Allegan County.

The ISO Audit went very well, and Hamilton Fire & Rescue is now rated at a "Class 6". We will continue to work for a "Class 5", which is possible, even though we do not have a fire hydrant system.

We had originally budgeted \$19,500.00 for the Live Burn Training Facility. However, with additional donations and adding Holland Fire and Clyde Fire to the partnership, Hamilton's share was reduced to \$11,500.00.

Hamilton Fire made it to the last day of FEMA Grant awards, before being eliminated. We are strongly encouraged to update our grant request for 2018 /2019 grant year, which we have done, and have resubmitted.

An area of need for our area is for "Heavy Rescue". One agency on it's own would have a difficult time in building one. In working with both Saugatuck and Graafschap Fire Departments, we have started to pool some of our rescue equipment to create a "Heavy Rescue" response truck, to be stationed in Graafschap, and is available to respond to anywhere in our area.

The reconstruction of M40 though Hamilton went well this past summer. We had very few interruptions, and MDOT and the construction people were great to work with. We are very disappointed in the fact M40 was not widened all the way to 136th Ave, which is still causing traffic issues.

We will be upgrading our computer reporting software program in January. We have had and continue to have problems with the current software system going down and no support to fix it. This problem has affected reporting to the State and Federal Gov't, which in turn affects our request for grants.

In long range planning, Rescue 860, will need to be replaced in the next 10 years. The truck is a 1998 and is 20 years old.

We at Hamilton Fire & Rescue have been blessed with a great group of people willing to serve as Firefighters/Medic's, that is not always the case in many agencies. Our response times and number of people responding is the best in the area, as noted by ISO and other fire agencies. Each year the demands place on these people continues to increase, from both call volume, nature of the incidents, and continuing education.

We continue to work with and share the support of our surrounding agencies, because more and more we realized that we can not always handle large scale incidents

on our own.

Heath Township Burning Ordinance

Adopted: September 8, 2003 Effective: October 17, 2003

Amendment Adopted: August 9, 2004 Effective: August 17, 2004

No open burning shall be permitted in Sections 5 and 6 of Heath Township, Allegan County, Michigan. However, a resident in Section 5 or 6 may apply to the Hamilton Fire Chief or designated officer to obtain a special permit for open burning or campfires. This permit request must be in written form. Residents may apply for a seasonal campfire permit as long as they have an approved fire ring. In consideration of any permit, adjoining property owners must be notified by an applicant. Open burning and campfires in other sections of the Township shall be governed by the provisions of Section IV.

Section IV **Provisions for Open Burning**

All open burning, as in out-of-doors burning on the ground, shall comply with the following provisions:

- 1. Be attended by a competent person at all times.
- 2. Burning to occur only after sunrise and extinguished and admitting no smoke after 9 p.m. or 10 p.m. during daylight savings time.
- 3. Burning shall occur at least fifteen feet (15') from any structure, fencing or woodpiles.
- 4. Burning shall occur at least fifteen feet (15') from any public or private property line.
- 5. No burning shall occur within a 24 hour period proceeding and during any Trick-or-Treat hours established by the Township Board.
- 6. No burning shall occur if it is determined by the Fire Chief that conditions are such that burning would be hazardous to health, safety, and general welfare of the citizens of the community.

Enforcement and Penalties

The enforcement of this ordinance and regulations established by the Township Board shall be performed by such person or persons as the Township Board designate by resolution. Any person, partnership, firm, association or corporation who shall fail to comply with the rules as defined and set forth in this ordinance, shall be deemed responsible for the municipal civil infraction as defined by Michigan Statue which shall be punishable by a civil fine determined in accordance with the following schedule:

1st Offense within 2 year period* \$100.00 2nd Offense within 2 year period* \$250.00 3rd Offense within 2 year period * \$500.00

*Determined on the basis of the date of commission of the offense(s).
