- 4. Not serving a sentence in jail or prison.





### HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE DISPOSAL

Heath Township Burning Ordinance

Adopted: September 8, 2003 Effective: October 17, 2003

Amendment Adopted: August 9, 2004 Effective: August 17, 2004

No open burning shall be permitted in Sections 5 and 6 of Heath Township, Allegan County, Michigan. However, a resident in Section 5 or 6 may apply to the Hamilton Fire Chief or designated officer to obtain a special permit for open burning or campfires. This permit request must be in written form. Residents may apply for a seasonal campfire permit as long as they have an approved fire ring. In consideration of any permit, adjoining property owners must be notified by an applicant. Open burning and campfires in other sections of the Township shall be governed by the provisions of Section IV.

### Section IV **Provisions for Open Burning**

All open burning, as in out-of-doors burning on the ground, shall comply with the following provisions:

- 1. Be attended by a competent person at all times.
- 2. Burning to occur only after sunrise and extinguished and admitting no smoke after 9 p.m. or 10 p.m. during daylight savings time.
- 3. Burning shall occur at least fifteen feet (15') from any structure, fencing or woodpiles.
- 4. Burning shall occur at least fifteen feet (15') from any public or private property line.
- 5. No burning shall occur within a 24 hour period proceeding and during any Trick-or-Treat hours established by the Township Board.
- 6. No burning shall occur if it is determined by the Fire Chief that conditions are such that burning would be hazardous to health, safety, and general welfare of the citizens of the community.

### **Enforcement and Penalties**

The enforcement of this ordinance and regulations established by the Township Board shall be performed by such person or persons as the Township Board designate by resolution. Any person, partnership, firm, association or corporation who shall fail to comply with the rules as defined and set forth in this ordinance, shall be deemed responsible for the municipal civil infraction as defined by Michigan Statue which shall be punishable by a civil fine determined in accordance with the following schedule:

1st Offense within 2 year period\* \$100.00 2nd Offense within 2 year period\* \$250.00 3rd Offense within 2 year period \* \$500.00

### **Assessment News**

Thank you to the home owners who took time to review and return the Residential Review form last year; I appreciate your verification that your assessment is accurate or noted if there is an error. I will be reviewing another 20% of the township in 2022 as required by the State Tax Commission.

Please contact Profession Code Inspectors if you desire to build, remodel, or demolish a structure on your property. To determine how much a new building or addition will increase your tax bill, use this formula: 50% of the value of the new construction / 1000 x millage rate = tax increase due to new construction.

Thank you to Randy Reimink, Kenn Westenbroek, and Kirk VanOrder for serving on the Board of Review. The board hears appeals brought by Heath Township property owners and determines the soundness of the appeal before making a determination.

In late February you will receive the Notice of Change in Assessment letter. If you believe the information is incorrect, you can make an appointment with the March Board of Review. We will be meeting March 15 from 2 –9 pm and March 17 from 9 am—4 pm. If you are unable to attend during those times, a written petition may be submitted to the board. ### 2022 Road Work



The following road work has been approved for Heath Township:

- Paving 41st St, 132nd Ave to 134th Ave. 1 mile
- Paving 128th Ave from M-40 west to end. .95 mile
- Paving Voss Ave from M-40 west to end. .20 mile
- Dust control on gravel roads will be applied 3 times to 9.5 miles of gravel.
- Gravel will be applied to some of the gravel roads. Roads to be determined.

### 2021 Hamilton Fire Department Report

As of December 1st, 2021, Hamilton Fire & Rescue has responded to 477 incidents. In comparison to December 1st, 2020, 424 incidents, we are showing a 12.5% increase in incident call volume.

We have been working with Assistant Chief from the Saugatuck Fire Department in writing a Fema Grant for the purchase of new SCBA Air Paks with 4500 PSI 30 minute Air Cylinders. We have to replace 8 sets in our Department. The Grant has been submitted.

In the past year we have completed 16 hours of Medical Continuing Education and 36 hours of Fire Continuing Education.

The jointly owned Live Fire Training Facility in Saugatuck is a huge asset for our continuing fire training. At our recent Live Training Facility board meeting, it was agreed to make as estimated \$12,000.00 worth of improvements to the facility.

Congratulations to Fire Fighter Dillion Vander Kamp on his completion and certification of his EMT license.

Hamilton Fire & Rescue was awarded a \$4,896.00 Safety Grant from Michigan Township Participating Plan. With this grant monies the Department had Back Road Services come and install reflective chevron striping on the rear of our fire apparatus.

The success of Hamilton Fire & Rescue is a direct reflection of the people who have and continue to step forward to serve our community, our community leaders, and most importantly the overwhelming support of our community.

# Outdoor Discovery Center Nature Preserve New in Heath Township!

The Rabbit River Preserve, located in Hamilton at 135<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 44<sup>th</sup> Street, is a 65 acre extension of the ODC Nature Preserve with a research and observational focus on riparian systems and forest ecology. This trail system is a wonderful site for viewing spring wildflowers, which will stay in bloom throughout the summer months. During daylight hours, it is a great location for running, walking, and hiking with a view. Motorized vehicles and horses are not permitted in the preserve. Please respect this unique ecosystem by staying on the designated trails and leaving the wildlife you find alone. We fully encourage you to visit the preserve to take in your surroundings and take some pictures of the beautiful wildflowers. While on your hike, you can also admire various species of songbirds and ducks.
