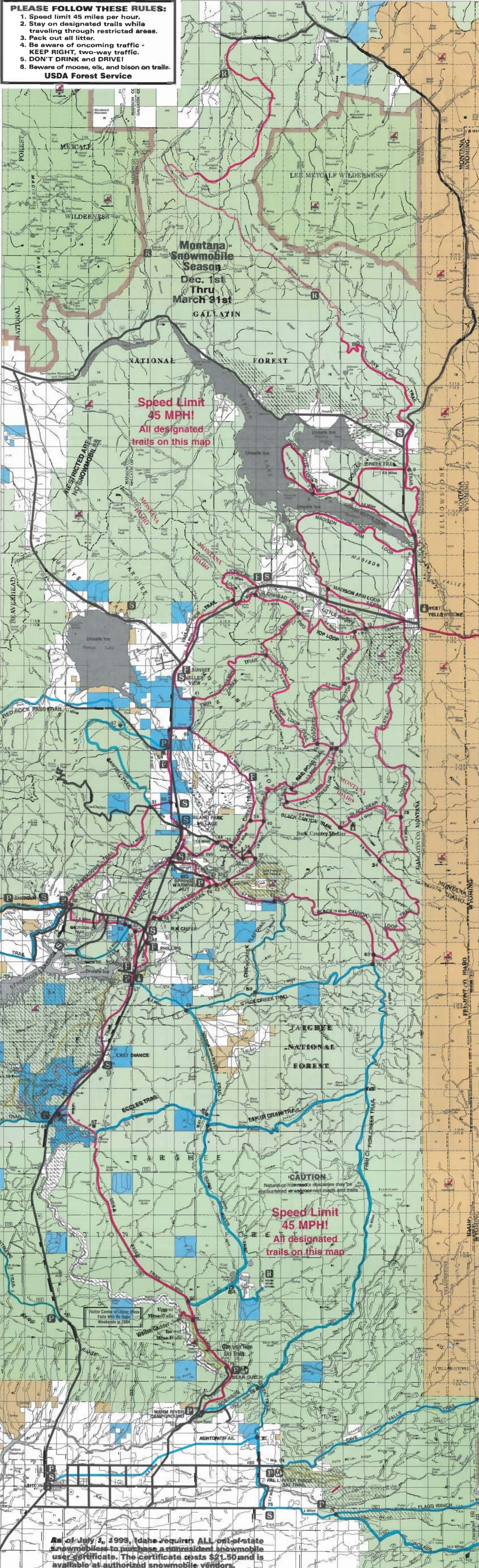


**PLEASE FOLLOW THESE RULES:**
